Genesis 1 and 2

Questions to Consider

1. Why is it important to believe God is the creator of everything?
2. What part of the creation account is hard to believe? Why is that part difficult and is there a Biblical explanation that would justify the difference to you?
3. As created beings, what does it mean to you to be made in God's image? What responsibility does this bring? What attributes do we possess that align with God? What changes do we need to make to be created in God's image?
4. What does this account of creation teach us about community? How does communing with one another improve God's design? Why weren't things good enough with just God and man? How does God's creation of Eve help us see our need to be in community with others?
5. Why do you think so many educators and scientist are so adamant that creation is fiction and evolution is the fact?
6. What insights do you gain about the character of God from the creation account? In light of Genesis 1, how does God feel about His creation and about human beings in specific?
7. If God is the creator of science, how can we reconcile those two things? If God is the ultimate creator and is sovereign over us, how should we respond to His ultimate creation?
