Characters of the Book of Esther HAMAN: Evil loser who tries to destroy Jews and later dies.

1 This is what happened during the time of Xerxes, the Xerxes who ruled over 127 provinces stretching from India to Cush:

² At that time King Xerxes reigned from his royal throne in the citadel of Susa, ³ and in the third year of his reign he gave a banquet

for all his nobles and officials. The military leaders of Persia and Media, the princes, and the nobles of the provinces were present.

⁴ For a full 180 days he displayed the vast wealth of his kingdom and the splendor and glory of his majesty. ⁵ When these days were over,

ESTHER 1:1-5 (NIV) the king gave a banquet, lasting seven days, in the enclosed garden of the king's palace,

ESTHER 1:1-5 (NIV) for all the people from the least to the greatest who were in the citadel of Susa.

ESTHER 1:8 (NIV) By the king's command each guest was allowed to drink with no restrictions,

ESTHER 1:8 (NIV) for the king instructed all the wine stewards to serve each man what he wished.

ESTHER 1:9-11 (NIV) 9 Queen Vashti also gave a banquet for the women in the royal palace of King Xerxes.

ESTHER 1:9-11 (NIV)

on the seventh day, when King Xerxes was in high spirits from wine, he commanded the seven eunuchs who served him—

ESTHER 1:9-11 (NIV) Mehuman, Biztha, Harbona, Bigtha, Abagtha, Zethar and Karkas—

ESTHER 1:9-11 (NIV)

11 to bring before him Queen Vashti, wearing her royal crown, in order to display her beauty to the people and nobles,

ESTHER 1:9-11 (NIV) for she was lovely to look at.

ESTHER 1:12 (NIV) But when the attendants delivered the king's command, Queen Vashti refused to come.

Then the king became furious and burned with anger.

ESTHER 1:19-20 (NIV)

19 "Therefore, if it pleases the king, let him issue a royal decree and let it be written in the laws of Persia and Media,

ESTHER 1:19-20 (NIV)
which cannot be repealed, that Vashti is never again
to enter the presence of King Xerxes.

ESTHER 1:19-20 (NIV) Also let the king give her royal position to someone else who is better than she.

ESTHER 1:19-20 (NIV)

Then when the king's edict is proclaimed throughout all his vast realm, all the women will respect their husbands,

ESTHER 1:19-20 (NIV) from the least to the greatest."

ESTHER 2:1-4 (NIV)

Later when King Xerxes' fury had subsided, he remembered Vashti and what she had done and what he had decreed about her.

ESTHER 2:1-4 (NIV) 2 Then the king's personal attendants proposed, "Let a search be made for beautiful young virgins for the king.

ESTHER 2:1-4 (NIV)

3 Let the king appoint commissioners in every province of his realm to bring all these beautiful young women into the harem

ESTHER 2:1-4 (NIV) at the citadel of Susa. Let them be placed under the care of Hegai, the king's eunuch, who is in charge of the women;

ESTHER 2:1-4 (NIV) and let beauty treatments be given to them. 4 Then let the young woman who pleases the king be queen instead of Vashti."

ESTHER 2:1-4 (NIV)

This advice appealed to the king, and he followed it.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV)

5 Now there was in the citadel of Susa a Jew of the tribe of Benjamin, named Mordecai son of Jair, the son of Shimei, the son of Kish,

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV) 6 who had been carried into exile from Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon,

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV)

among those taken captive with Jehoiachin king of Judah.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV)

7 Mordecai had a cousin named Hadassah, whom he had brought up because she had neither father nor mother.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV) This young woman, who was also known as Esther, had a lovely figure and was beautiful.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV) Mordecai had taken her as his own daughter when her father and mother died.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV) 8 When the king's order and edict had been proclaimed, many young women were brought to the citadel of Susa

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV)

and put under the care of Hegai. Esther also was taken to the king's palace and entrusted to Hegai, who had charge of the harem.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV)

9 She pleased him and won his favor. Immediately he provided her with her beauty treatments and special food.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV) He assigned to her seven female attendants selected from the king's palace

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV) and moved her and her attendants into the best place in the harem.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV)

10 Esther had not revealed her nationality and family background, because Mordecai had forbidden her to do so.

ESTHER 2:5-11 (NIV)

11 Every day he walked back and forth near the courtyard of the harem to find out how Esther was and what was happening to her.

12 Before a young woman's turn came to go in to King Xerxes, she had to complete twelve months of beauty treatments

ESTHER 2:12 (NIV) prescribed for the women, six months with oil of myrrh and six with perfumes and cosmetics.

1 SAMUEL 16:7 (NIV)

The LORD does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

1 SAMUEL 16:7 (NIV) But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him.

15 When the turn came for Esther (the young woman Mordecai had adopted, the daughter of his uncle Abihail) to go to the king,

ESTHER 2:15-18 (NIV) she asked for nothing other than what Hegai, the king's eunuch who was in charge of the harem, suggested.

ESTHER 2:15-18 (NIV)

And Esther won the favor of everyone who saw her. 16 She was taken to King Xerxes in the royal residence in the tenth month,

ESTHER 2:15-18 (NIV)

the month of Tebeth, in the seventh year of his reign.

ESTHER 2:15-18 (NIV)
17 Now the king was attracted to Esther more than to any of the other women,

ESTHER 2:15-18 (NIV) and she won his favor and approval more than any of the other virgins. So he set a royal crown on her head and made her queen

instead of Vashti. 18 And the king gave a great banquet, Esther's banquet, for all his nobles and officials.



ISAIAH 53:2-5 (NIV)

5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him,

ISAIAH 53:2-5 (NIV) and by his wounds we are healed.
