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I PROMISE Jeremiah 34-35

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord, when Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon and all his army

and all the kingdoms of the earth under his dominion and all the peoples were fighting against Jerusalem and all of its cities:

2 "Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel: Go and speak to Zedekiah king of Judah and say to him,

'Thus says the Lord: Behold, I am giving this city into the hand of the king of Babylon, and he shall burn it with fire.

3 You shall not escape from his hand but shall surely be captured and delivered into his hand.

You shall see the king of Babylon eye to eye and speak with him face to face. And you shall go to Babylon.'

4 Yet hear the word of the Lord, O Zedekiah king of Judah! Thus says the Lord concerning you: 'You shall not die by the sword.

5 You shall die in peace. And as spices were burned for your fathers, the former kings who were before you,

so people shall burn spices for you and lament for you, saying, "Alas, lord!" For I have spoken the word, declares the Lord."

6 Then Jeremiah the prophet spoke all these words to Zedekiah king of Judah, in Jerusalem,

JOHN 3:16 (ESV)

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

ROMANS 8:28 (ESV)

And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.

MATTHEW 6:33 (ESV)

But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

1 CORINTHIANS 10:13 (ESV)

No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability,

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but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.


What's your favorite promise of God in Scripture?

ECCLESIASTES 5:5 (NLT)

It is better to say nothing than to make a promise and not keep it.

8 The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord, after King Zedekiah had made a covenant with all the people

in Jerusalem to make a proclamation of liberty to them, 9 that everyone should set free his Hebrew slaves, male and female,

so that no one should enslave a Jew, his brother.

10 And they obeyed, all the officials and all the people who had entered into the covenant that everyone would set free his slave,

male or female, so that they would not be enslaved again. They obeyed and set them free.

11 But afterward they turned around and took back the male and female slaves they had set free,

and brought them into subjection as slaves.

The word of the Lord came to Jeremiah from the Lord: 13 "Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel:

I myself made a covenant with your fathers when I brought them out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, saying,

14 'At the end of seven years each of you must set free the fellow Hebrew who has been sold to you and has served you six years;

you must set him free from your service.' But your fathers did not listen to me or incline their ears to me.

15 You recently repented and did what was right in my eyes by proclaiming liberty, each to his neighbor,

and you made a covenant before me in the house that is called by my name,

16 but then you turned around and profaned my name when each of you took back his male and female slaves,

whom you had set free according to their desire, and you brought them into subjection to be your slaves.

And when the Chaldeans who were besieging Jerusalem heard news about them, they withdrew from Jerusalem.

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord in the days of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah:

² "Go to the house of the Rechabites and speak with them and bring them to the house of the Lord, into one of the chambers;

then offer them wine to drink."

3 So I took Jaazaniah the son of Jeremiah, son of Habazziniah and his brothers and all his sons and the whole house of the Rechabites.

4 I brought them to the house of the Lord into the chamber of the sons of Hanan the son of Igdaliah, the man of God,

which was near the chamber of the officials, above the chamber of Maaseiah the son of Shallum, keeper of the threshold.

5 Then I set before the Rechabites pitchers full of wine, and cups, and I said to them, "Drink wine."

6 But they answered, "We will drink no wine, for Jonadab the son of Rechab, our father, commanded us,

'You shall not drink wine, neither you nor your sons forever.

⁷ You shall not build a house; you shall not sow seed; you shall not plant or have a vineyard; but you shall live in tents all your days,

that you may live many days in the land where you sojourn.'

8 We have obeyed the voice of Jonadab the son of Rechab, our father, in all that he commanded us, to drink no wine all our days,

ourselves, our wives, our sons, or our daughters, 9 and not to build houses to dwell in.

We have no vineyard or field or seed,

10 but we have lived in tents and have obeyed and done all that Jonadab our father commanded us.

11 But when Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came up against the land, we said,

'Come, and let us go to Jerusalem for fear of the army of the Chaldeans and the army of the Syrians.'

So we are living in Jerusalem."



They lived by the ancient command and not by trendy culture.

16 The sons of Jonadab the son of Rechab have kept the command that their father gave them, but this people has not obeyed me.

17 Therefore, thus says the Lord, the God of hosts, the God of Israel:

Behold, I am bringing upon Judah and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem all the disaster that I have pronounced against them,

because I have spoken to them and they have not listened, I have called to them and they have not answered."

18 But to the house of the Rechabites Jeremiah said, "Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel:

Because you have obeyed the command of Jonadab your father and kept all his precepts and done all that he commanded you,

19 therefore thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Jonadab the son of Rechab shall never lack a man to stand before me."
