Discussion Questions

- 1. What did you take away from Genesis 31 33? What did you learn about God's heart? How is God changing you, your thoughts and your actions?
- 2. In hard times, Jacob discerned the will of God and began his journey home. Where are you in need of direction? How can you discern God's will?
- 3. In desperation, Jacob turns and prays to God in 32:9-12. What does your prayer life look like? How does this story challenge you in prayer? Where have you recently seen God answer prayer?
- 4. What fear or doubt has caused you to wrestle with God? What has God taught you through your wrestling? How can we hold to Him? Use scripture to encourage one another.
- 5. How do you face your greatest fear or guilt in life? What reassurance does God's Word give you?
- 6. Jacob walked away from wrestling with God a changed and surrendered man. What marks your change? Where might God be calling you to further surrender?
