"In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." Genesis 1:1

1. What does it say? (Observation)

- A. Print a copy. Write all over it.
- B. Read, reread, read it again. Different versions.
- C. Ask who, what, when, where, and how?
- D. Note key words, thoughts, ideas, repetition.
- E. Note anything confusing or questions you have.

2. What does it mean? (Interpretation)

- A. Try and rewrite it in your own words, still true to its original meaning. Wrestle with the text ON YOUR OWN.
- B. Look up unfamiliar words (in a regular dictionary).
- C. What did I learn about God? Mankind? Myself?
- D. Cross-references similar theme, words, ideas
- E. What's the main thing? The big idea?

3. How should it change me? (Application)

- A. How does God want me to respond to Him?
- B. What change needs to happen as a result of studying this passage?
- C. How does this apply to my life today?
- D. Note: it may not always be "do something." It may be just to learn, believe, or accept what you read.
